



A Letter from the President July 2024

For many years, Temple Shalom has welcomed both members and non-members to attend High Holy Day services at no cost. There was no

pre-registration requirement and walk-ins were welcomed without checking their ID. When Temple Shalom reopened for in-person High Holy Day services following COVID, the world had changed. All non-members were asked to pre-register for health and safety reasons. With ID and proof of vaccination, walk-ins were allowed. Admission remained free for both members and non-members.

As is the tradition during the High Holy Days, both members and non-members were asked to make HH donations to the Temple. Non-member donations have not been very generous in the past few years. Some non-members, who have been attending for years, say they will join and are not seen or heard from again until the next year. Our ability to offer services, programs, and the support of other Jews comes from our members who accept the responsibility of supporting a synagogue, attending services and functions, and volunteering.

As of June 2024, our policy of including High Holy Day admission as part of Temple Shalom's membership, with no additional fee, will continue. All non-members wishing to attend High Holiday services **must** pre-register and will be charged a per person admission fee to include all five High Holy Day services.

Fee Structure:

Members – Free

Members' spouses/partners or one adult child if a member does not have a spouse/partner may attend all services for free.

Non-members (unaffiliated with a URJ congregation) - \$175 admission fee, per person giving you admission to all five HH services. This fee, per person, may be applied toward 2024-2025 membership dues if they join by October 15, 2024. Pre-registration, including ID, will be required

Non-members affiliated with a URJ congregation – reciprocity with proof of membership and ID, suggested donation of \$36.

Since October 7, 2023, our world has changed again. For security reasons, **no walk-ins will be** permitted.

The Jewish tradition teaches that all human beings are created b'tselem Elohim – in the Image of God. And both the Jewish and Christian traditions teach the importance of "love your neighbor as yourself." Insulting and demeaning other human beings is inconsistent with both Jewish and Christian values.

Every Temple Shalom board meeting and annual membership meeting begins with a prayer in which we pray to God to help us treat those who have different views than our own with respect. We pray for the wisdom to disagree without being disagreeable.

In a politically divided country like the United States, it is important to recognize that citizens we disagree with are not foreign agents or traitors, but fellow Americans whose views are different from our own. It is not good for the health of our democracy when candidates for political office refer to fellow citizens or public officials as "scum," as "vermin," as "low lifes" as "degenerates" or as "communists and fascists." This type of language is designed to dehumanize opponents and is reminiscent of the language that the Nazi regime in Germany used to describe the Jews.

Insulting and demeaning people we disagree with destroys the fabric of a democratic society. Even if we disagree with people, we have to live with them and respect them. This type of language is dangerous.

We have the right to vote for the candidate whose proposed policies coincide with our views. But political discourse should be kept out of the gutter.

Another way we've committed to combating antisemitism and hate in the Lowcountry is through the creation of the first <u>Joint Incident Reporting</u> <u>Tool</u>, in partnership between our Federation, the ADL Southeast, and Secure Community Network. A SPECIAL OPPORTUNITY TO HELP TEMPLE SHALOM PURCHASE NEW "WINGS" TO ADD TO OUR MEMORIAL BOARD

If you have been to Temple Shalom lately, you may have noticed that our MEMORIAL BOARD is almost full. Earlier this month, the Board approved a motion to purchase two (2) additional wings (that is really the name of the pieces) to add to the memorial board (one on each side). Each wing will hold 20 plaques, for a total of 40 more plaques on our memorial board. The total cost for this necessary purchase and installation next to the existing memorial board will be around \$8,000.

You will recall that a short while ago we had to raise the prices for the plaques due to our increased costs. Those costs are rising again. To offset the cost of the plaques AND the cost of the wings, the Board also approved the following ways that members can purchase plaques and/or contribute to the cost of the wings:

PLAQUES:

- Each plaque purchased by a member for a deceased person before June 30, 2024, will cost \$250.00.*
- Each plaque purchased by a member for a deceased person beginning July 1, 2024, will cost \$300.00.*
- Each plaque purchased by a member for themselves for the future will be the same cost as above based on the date ordered.**
- If the member chooses to purchase a "Reserved" plaque to hold their spot on the memorial board, an additional \$125.00 will be added to the cost.**

CONTRIBUTING TO THE COST OF THE WINGS: All donations must be received by August 30, 2024.

- Each member who wishes to contribute to the new wings may donate any amount and will be listed on the donation acknowledgement plaque.
- Each member who donates a minimum of \$600.00 will be listed on the donation acknowledgement plaque AND will have the
 option of receiving one (1) future plaque (for them after their passing) and a "Reserved" sign to hold their place on the board at no
 additional cost. Donations of \$600 or more are NOT required to take advantage of the future plaque and/or "Reserved" sign.
- * 50% is due when ordered and 50% prior to being hung on the memorial board or may be paid in full when ordering.
- ** Must be paid in full when ordering.

PLEASE NOTE: Pricing is subject to change at any time as our costs increase.
