A Letter from Our Past President September 2025

Temple Shalom is a non-profit organization. We depend on dues, donations, small fundraisers, and event charges for income. At this time of year, as we celebrate a New Year, it is traditional for members and guests to give a donation to help start our year in a strong financial position. But the Temple needs your help on a regular basis. Your dues help pay for our Rabbi and a few expenses; but, as we all know, keeping our building safe, insured, clean, and useable takes money. As the expenses of everyday life at Temple Shalom continue to increase, we count on your generosity to keep us going.

Temple Shalom provides basic services within our dues and fundraising structure. Members are assured of free admission to High Holiday services, the Rabbi offers his services at little or no cost for life events (funerals, weddings), there is no charge for aliyot, Onegs (unless you volunteer to host or sponsor an Oneg), kiddushim, adult education programs, and other activities. But all of these still cost money. It is important that we realize that our source of income is our members and guests. Every donation, small or large, helps us continue to operate. Some of the ways you can donate are:

- 1, Drop a few dollars in the **tzedakah** boxes at each door when you attend services or events at the temple.
- 2. **Chai Club** this is an easy way to donate regularly. Membership is a minimum of \$18 per person per month \$216.00 per year. No meetings for this club, just a painless way to help the temple.
  - 3. Traditional donations are made at the High Holidays and for yahrzeits.
- 4. Purchase a **Memorial Plaque** for a loved one. Purchase a reserved plaque so that your place on our memorial board is assured.
- 5. Purchase a plaque to celebrate a birthday, graduation, birth of a new baby, and other life cycle events on our **Tree of Life.**
- 6. Donate paper towels, toilet tissue, paper plates, plastic ware and/or small water bottles. We use an incredible amount of paper goods. Check with Kitchen chairperson or President before you donate and we can tell you what we need.
- 7. Make a donation in memory of someone who has died or is sick or in distress. We know that not everyone is in a position to give donations regularly. If you need assistance with paying dues, contact our treasurer to work out this issue. You can set up a payment schedule that works for you and the temple. Our temple is special to all of us. Please give what you can. Thank you.

Rabbi Sherman

Here are some of my initial observations of Temple Shalom.

In my sermon on July 25<sup>th</sup>, I spoke about a church critic. I asked what he would say about Temple Shalom. I think he would describe the members of Temple Shalom as one big family who are there for one another in times of sadness and who come together to celebrate moments of joy. I have already witnessed how you check in with one another.

We have a strong lay leadership. We have a high percentage of our members who regularly participate and are very involved in the many activities that take place here. Temple Shalom benefited from the many years of leadership, commitment, and dedication that Rabbi David Weisman provided so wonderfully for this congregation.

I understand that the early history of Temple Shalom included placing an ad in the local paper for people to come to a planning meeting regarding the establishment of a new Reform Temple. I am happy to learn that we still have several people who remain in the Temple who answered that ad and became founding members of the congregation. I suggested that we might think about placing another ad. Later it was brought to my attention that there no longer is one newspaper that everyone reads regularly. Well, we can figure out another way of getting the word out about Temple Shalom.

Jaime and Bill are excellent examples of people who fairly recently joined the Temple and right away began contributing to the welfare of our Temple. From what I understand, they were looking for a connection to Judaism. We have Rabbi Daron to thank, as he suggested to Jaime and Bill that they check out all of the synagogues in town and see what feels best. Bill and Jaime told me that when they first walked through the doors of Temple Shalom, they knew that Temple Shalom was the right fit for them. I have already witnessed how we warmly welcome new comers

to the Temple, which is something we should be proud of and not take for granted.

Let's try to encourage others to contact the Temple, so they can register and attend a Shabbat or festival service.

There may be a worry, that with new people, the very character of Temple Shalom that we like the most, will diminish. I am not seeking a huge increase in the number of people who belong here. I want to attract people who are willing to roll up their sleeves and get to work. We are not a big Temple with a large staff that has lots of programing, so that new people just have to show up and their needs will be taken care of. No, we have an expectation that everyone contributes both financially and with their time and energy, just like all of you do.

I think that you realize it already but let me reiterate that Temple Shalom is a real gem. It is my hope that we do not keep this our secret. Myrtle Beach and Horry County's population is growing. I think that it is safe to say, that a percentage of the newcomers are Jewish. Let's figure out a way to get the word out to them.

I look forward to learning more about what attracted you to become involved in Temple Shalom, and what are the reasons that you continue to be active in our community. When we learn more from one another, we will have an even better idea of what to highlight for prospective members.

Rabbi Chaim Stern reminds us: "Tasks great and small wait us; patiently they wait for us to arrive with enough strength of mind to undertake them, where or not we have the strength to complete them. So, God, we pray, give us time enough to see something of our hopes and ideals come true; and give us the will to make the effort to accomplish some part of our highest aims."

It is my hope that in a few years when we look back, we can say that we have welcomed people new to Judaism to our community and helped them find a home here, and that we have reached out and brought some new souls into our already wonderful community.
